STANDING ORDER

FOR EXHIBITS ENTERED INTO EVIDENCE AT THE TRIAL COURT LEVEL

Any party at interest, or counsel for such party, wishing to have exhibits returned that were introduced into evidence at the trial court level prior to March 1, 2022, in cases that have reached final disposition, must request same by April 1, 2023. If a request is not made by said date, the exhibits will be destroyed.

From the date of this order forward, any and all exhibits must be requested within one year of the final disposition of the case or said exhibits will be destroyed.

Any party at interest, or counsel for such party, wanting to obtain any exhibits, must notify the current court reporter assigned to the judge presiding over the case. If the judge that presided over the case is no longer a sitting Madison County judge, notify the court reporter that is assigned to the judge currently serving in the position vacated by the previous judge. In the event the case was appealed and has reached final disposition, the exhibits must be requested from the clerk's office. If you are unsure of which court reporter to notify, you may contact the office of the Madison County Presiding Judge for assistance.

Upon execution of an appropriate receipt, exhibits will be released.

Only the party at interest, or counsel for such party, that moved to enter the exhibits into evidence may request said exhibits.

Any item constituting contraband or firearms will not be released.
