STANDING ORDER
FILING OF EXHIBITS IN JUVENILE APPEALS


Whenever parties to the juvenile proceeding, to include the Alabama Department of Human Resources, have contracted with a freelance firm or freelancers to provide a court reporter for hearings, and when an appeal is filed, exhibits are required to be filed by the court reporter filing the appeal pursuant to Rule 11 (e), Ala.R.App.P.

The Judges of the 23rd Judicial Circuit have determined that it is essential for the administration of justice and the protection of the rights of all parties involved in such proceedings that the court reporter who reported the proceedings file the exhibits with the Clerk of the Court at the time of filing the appeal. Therefore, the following is hereby ORDERED:


1. The court reporter that reported the proceedings will obtain the exhibits from the office of the Judge that presided over the proceedings on the day they file the appeal with the Clerk of the Court.
2. The court reporter will complete ARAP-11, Court Reporter's Index of Trial Exhibits, <https://efirms.alacourt.gov/appellate-forms/> and file said form, along with the exhibits, on the day the appeal is filed with the Clerk of the Court.

Failure to comply with this Order may result in the court reporter and/or the firm owner, managing reporter, or representative being ordered to a Hearing to Show Cause to show why they should not be sanctioned and/or held in contempt of court.
